By building your fires with wood cleared in the Newton Hill restoration, you'll get an extra-warm feeling knowing you've helped fund this all-volunteer effort to make Worcester a more wonderful place to live.

Snuggle up by a cozy fire while doing good for one of Worcester's true treasures: Newton Hill at Elm Park. Bundles of firewood are available at Blue Jeans for a suggested donation of \$4 (about half what bundled wood costs in a store). And the wood in these bundles burns more quickly and hotter than unsplit logs.

In 2001 a volunteer restoration began of this section of Elm Park – across Park Ave from the ponds. (Haven't walked the cleared trails in a while [or ever]? You really ought to.) These 41 acres had been long-neglected.

Among the work that's been done already is trail-clearing, trash collection, and grass

cutting to return the area to its once-desired appearance. Also, there's a summer work program for older teens, a concert series and other events.

Your financial support is always welcome (the group is saving for a small chipper [almost \$4000]), they also need more volunteer help, and they go through shovels, handsaws and pruners at a good rate – donations of these items are always welcome.

"Give me two eggs and I'll have twice as many as you," said the first.

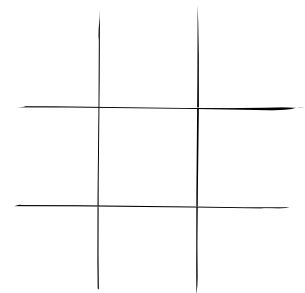
"No," said the other, "but you give me one of yours, and then we'll be sum and sum alike."
